Rowland, Bassett and Mt. SAC (2) will present at our next work group meeting.

CALPRO Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Institute- Seminars are coming up and focus on PLC. Workshops and Trainings that will be offered in BP. Sage and Ryan will be a hub for the consortium. CALPRO will send out a representative to come out and conduct a workshop. They receive funding to do these trainings. They have a whole list of topics online and Ryan will make arrangements to make the workshop available on site. They have an ongoing series on PLC.

Development and Implement technology into instruction.

California Adult Literacy Professional Development Project website has online trainings that you can participate in. They are a major resources. Its research based.
