Agenda Run through conference presentation Minutes 1. Run through 1 Alex – 10 minutes allotted for digital citizenship presentation. Ask audience to hold questions for the end Make sure to discuss why the standards are important Don't qualify any bullet points as being for younger students Only share one bullet on each slide if you don't have enough time Describe the tech slam & how to participate at the end of the presentation Norm – 3 minutes allotted for Crash Course Don't show entire video Describe what it is, how to use it in the classroom, and what the results of using it are Mention that his students enjoy it Diana - 3 minutes allotted for Common Sense Media Norm – 3 minutes allotted for Khan Academy Describe what it is, how to use it in the classroom, and what the results of using it are Play only a sample of the video Diana – 3 minutes allotted for Flocabulary Debbie – 3 minutes allotted for Digital Badges

Should bring awareness to the topic



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- What is it? Why should we consider it? What is involved in implementing it?
- Discuss the differences between using it as a motivational tool and using it as a certificate of merit.

Alex – 3 minutes allotted for Algebra Help

- Explain what it is and how to use it in the classroom
- Show lessons, worksheet, and calculator

Debbie – About 6 minutes allotted for explaining and playing Kahoot

• Make it clear that you can log in using the app or a web browser

There needs to be one document available for all presenters that has direct links to the tech slam presentation websites.

2. Run through 2

Ran more smoothly than the first. Alex's digital citizenship portion needs to be shorter than the first time, but longer than the second. Some tech slams are only two minutes. If they go short OK to count down and SLAM early.

Recommended to get audience engaged by asking, "How many of you have heard of _____?" "How many of you use _____?" etc.
