#### Minutes

- 1. Powers Assessment
- The group discussed the Powers Assessment test they may be needing to use in the near future to assess their students.
- Powers is a one on one observational assessment.
- The booklets seemed to be outdated and pricy to the instructors.
- Next meeting bring current assessment and then compare them to the powers testing. So we can see the gaps and see what needs to be added or taken out.
- 2. Transitions
- How do we prevent transitions from becoming a dead end?
- There is no formal procedure in place for referring students to transition.
- A written form will be very beneficial to students because it will prevent them from falling through the gaps
- When transitioning a student from the academic to workplace the process is also through referrals.
- Regional center
- There is a need to create a master consortium guide that is accessible to people in the subject areas that we work with. Not a formal policy just something people can refer to if asked
- Example: What is in place for student transition? When do you refer, who do you refer, and what does a transitional program refer to?
- Need for a definite referral.
- 3. Workforce Academies
- Will integrate basic academic skills in order to work.
- Highly focused to certain jobs.
